Howard was born in 1933, and he had two brothers and a sister to help him when he got into trouble. Howard was a native of Ontario and spent his formative years in Toronto. After his formal and technical education he entered the HVAC industry at an early stage in his career. He worked with mechanical contractors in various positions advancing to General Manager in 1965. In 1969, Howard joined the well known Consulting Engineering Firm of T.M.P., where he stayed until 1973 solving many job-related field problems. He also became known as a very articulate technical writer. Afterwards, Howard teamed up with Black & McDonald Ltd. He held various responsible positions in this company and was Executive Vice-President during the last few years at the Head Office in Toronto.

Howard was married to his lovely wife Shirley, and had three children, a son David, and two daughters Lynn and Judy, and at the time of this report two grand children Thomas and William Sheridan.
